AIM OF THE COURSE

To provide platform to the officers of the level of DIsG of CRPF/CAPFs, equivalent officers from armed forces, State Police and administration for discussing present Internal Security problems of the country and the strategies to deal with them.

SCOPE OF THE COURSE

1. Sharpen the awareness of the complex & complicated Internal Security problem facing the country.
2. Refresh the legal knowledge relevant to the subject.
3. Create a forum for free and frank discussions and dissemination of new ideas and innovations in matters concerning management of Internal Security.
4. Utilize participants' expertise on specific aspects of policing through experience sharing.
5. Expose the participants to latest techniques of public order management.
6. Help appreciate Human Rights issue and the Role of Police.
7. Identify the emerging threats of Internal Security at National/International level.
8. Study the internal and external environments in which the Police Forces function.

ELIGIBILITY

Deputy Inspectors General of Police of CRPF, other CAPF's, State Police and equivalent officers from Armed Forces. This is also a pre-promotional course for DIsG of CRPF to become eligible for promotion to the next rank i.e. IG in CRPF.
