

## **SENIOR LEVEL INTERNAL SECURITY COURSE**

### **AIM OF THE COURSE**

To provide platform to the officers of the level of SSP/SP/Comdt/Second-in-command of CRPF/CAPFs, equivalent officers from armed forces, State Police and administration for discussing present Internal Security problems of the country and the strategies/tactics to deal with them.

### **SCOPE OF THE COURSE**

1. Develop an awareness of the complex and complicated Internal Security problems being faced by the country.
2. Analyze the problems faced by the officers in the field and to explore alternative strategies for tackling them.
3. Give exposure to latest techniques in maintenance of Internal Security.
4. Develop conceptual understanding of emerging threats to Internal Security of the State.
5. Appreciate Human Rights issues and role of Police.
6. Comprehend and evaluate the expectations of society with regard to speedy and effective justice.
7. Promote understanding and co-ordination among different organs of Criminal Justice System and Police.

SSsP/SsP, Executive Magistrates (DMs/ADMs) from States and Commandants and Second – in – Commands CRPF/CAPFs and equivalent officers from Armed Forces having minimum 8 years of service.
