AIM:-

To provide platform for discussing the complex problems of the Human Rights, Internal Security, challenges before Law enforcing agencies and effective strategies to deal with them.

SCOPE OF THE COURSE:-

1. Sharpen the awareness of the complex & complicated Internal Security problems facing the country.
2. Enable the participants to appreciate present challenges of Internal Security and Human Rights and related issues vis-à-vis role of police and security forces.
3. Create a forum for free and frank discussion based on the practical problems for cross-fertilization of ideas.
4. Upgrade professional knowledge and skill through experience sharing.
5. Identify the emerging threats of Internal Security at National/International level.
6. Study the internal and external environments in which the Police Forces function.

Assistant Commandant to Deputy Inspector General and equivalent level officers from CRPF, other CAPFs, State Police, Armed Forces.

1.	Human Rights -The History, growth, content, concept practice and percept.
2.	U.N. Declaration on Human Rights, International Covenants, other Humanitarian Laws and Constitution of India.
3.	Protections to Human Rights Acts 1993, Role of National Human Rights Commission.
4.	Human Rights in peace time and in conflict situations. Dos & Don'ts for Police in protection of HR, protection to weaker & vulnerable sections of society.
5.	Human Rights and Commanders Responsibility- Use of force and fire arms, conduct of operations, arrest and detention, maintenance of public order & HR during riots/large scale violence.
6.	Views and reviews on latest Human Rights issues, strengths and weaknesses, Human Rights cases on Security Forces/Police - Panel discussion.
7.	Current Internal Security Scenario, threats, challenges, latest intelligence reports, International/Cross border terrorism and its impact in India.
8.	Challenges in LWE before police and security forces with ref. to CRPF
9.	Current situation of Terrorism in J&K including agitational terrorism, remedial measures and tactics being adopted by police & security forces.
10.	Insurgency in Northern Eastern states – contemporary view point.
11.	Case studies of successful and unsuccessful ops of all theatres (J&K, NE, LWE) and lessons learnt.
12.	IED challenges and responses.
13.	Opening, Course Inauguration, Registration and Closing.

Note:- 1) In addition to above, brain storming/open sessions/group discussions /workshops, screening of training films etc. will also be a part of the course in pursuance to Training Directorate, CRPF directives to include smart practices.

2) Academy can do some para-phrasing of the sub-topics mentioned in detailed syllabus as per need, requirement, immediate feedback and utility of trainees, without changing the block time table and block syllabus.
